## N SEOUL TOWER

Namsan Seoul Tower was the first multipurpose tower to be established in Korea, effectively incorporating a sightseeing observatory to a broadcasting tower. For the past 40 years, Namsan Seoul Tower has served as an iconic landmark of Korea and a representative tourist attraction. The tower's observatory offers an unobstructed view of the whole city, allowing it to become one of the all-time favorite attractions of Seoul citizens as well as domestic and international tourists.

# GYEONGBOKGUNG PALACE

Built in 1395, Gyeongbokgung Palace is commonly referred to as the Northern Palace because its location is furthest north when compared to the neighboring palaces of Changdeokgung (Eastern Palace) and Gyeonghuigung (Western Palace). Gyeongbokgung Palace is arguably the most beautiful, and remains the largest of all five palaces.

## BUKCHON HANOK VILLAGE

The name Bukchon, which literally translates to "northern village," came about as the neighborhood lies north of two significant Seoul landmarks, Cheonggyecheon Stream and Jongno. Today, many of these hanoks operate as cultural centers, guesthouses, restaurants, and tea houses, providing visitors with an opportunity to experience, learn and immerse themselves in traditional Korean culture.

# CHEONGGYECHEON STREAM

Cheonggyecheon Stream is a 10.9-kilometer-long (6.8 mi) modern public recreation space in downtown Seoul, South Korea. The massive urban renewal project is on the site of a stream that flowed before the rapid post-war economic development causing it to be covered by transportation infrastructure.

## INSADONG ARTS

Insadong Arts in South Korea is a lively neighborhood in Seoul known for its artistic ambiance. It features art galleries, studios, and artisan shops showcasing traditional Korean crafts. Visitors can enjoy delicious Korean cuisine, explore historic landmarks like Jogyesa Temple, and shop at unique places like Ssamziegil. The district also hosts cultural events and festivals, offering a rich cultural experience.

## BLUE HOUSE

Blue House or Cheong Wa Dae is a complex of multiple buildings, mainly built in the traditional Korean architectural style with some modern architectural elements and facilities. Cheong Wa Dae consists of the Main Office Hall Bon-gwan, the Presidential Residence, the State Reception House Yeongbin-gwan, the Chunchu-gwan, Press Hall, and the Secretariat Buildings. The entire complex covers approximately 250,000 square meters or 62 acres.
